

Frequently Asked Questions

If I make a payroll deduction pledge now, when will withholding start?

Withholding will start with the first payroll in 2012.

If I want to keep my payroll deduction the same as last year, do I have to do anything?

Technically, no. However, we encourage you to review your contribution from last year by logging on to www.insecc.org and clicking on “Pledge Now”.

When will my charity receive my money?

One-time contributions are disbursed in April. Payroll deduction contributions are sent to the charities in April, July, October and February of the following year.

How can I contribute?

You have the option of making your contribution through payroll deduction, one time contributions via credit card using e-Pledge, and cash or check contributions using a paper pledge form. Payroll deduction pledges take effect with the first payroll in 2012.

Is there a minimum contribution amount?

Yes, the minimum payroll deduction pledge is \$1 per pay per charity. The minimum one-time contribution (cash, check or credit card) is \$5 per charity.

SECC Pledge Options

1. Log on to www.insecc.org and make your pledge. **It's quick. It's easy. It's secure.**
 - The e-Pledge system will allow you to contribute through payroll deduction, or you can make a one-time contribution using your credit card.
 - Click on the “Pledge Now” button. Decide how much to give and then choose the charities to which you want to contribute.
2. State employees can still use a paper pledge form, which can be acquired from your agency's SECC coordinator. State employees wishing to make a one-time contribution by cash or check **must** use a paper pledge form.

Your contribution helps to insure that the charities and programs you support will be there in the future to help improve lives.
