

## Facts About Last Year's SECC

- The 2009-2010 State Employees' Community Campaign (SECC) raised more than **\$1.2 million** that benefited **2,000** charitable organizations. That amount represents a slight increase over the prior year.
- More than one-fifth of state employees participated in the SECC. The per capita contribution was more than **\$37.00**, the highest it has been in the history of the Campaign.
- The success of the 2009-2010 SECC was assured by the **1,345** men and women who made a **Champion**-level contribution (a half-hour's pay per check). They contributed \$759,797, more than half of the total raised through the 2009-2010 SECC.
- Recognition is given to those state agencies where **20%** or more of its donors make a contribution at the Champion level of giving. This year, the number of state agencies being recognized with the **Champion Award** continued to grow, with more than one-third of state agencies being recognized with that award.
- **Leadership Giving**: In the SECC just completed, the number of state employees making a **Torchbearer Society**-level contribution (\$1,000 or more) grew again. In the 2009-2010 SECC, **201** state employees were members of the Torchbearer Society, contributing more than **\$340,111**, more than 25% of the total raised.
